It is with a humble request that I seek for your assistance in my secondary school fees. I am a girl aged fourteen presently in class eight. I live in Kenyatta estate with my mother and my young brother. I am the sixth born in my family and sibling for my

My elder brother Charles Nwangi is 31 years old with two children. Second born is Esther Wangari 20 yrs old married with three children. Third born Anthony Macharia 26 years old with one child. Fourth born Stephen Maina 24 years old with no child.

All the above siblings reached class eight because of lack of school fees. Each one is struggling to live and do not help my mother because they also have their own challenges.

We used to live with my father in North Kinagop and he abandoned us last year and we faced a lot of challenges that made us come to Nloto. He has never contacted us to give us any help. Our ~~fifth~~ ⁱⁿ born is in form 3 in Njenga Kanme Secondary School. which is a day school. Most of the times my mother tries to save for her fees but her brother (my uncle) sometimes helps her when she is sent away for fees. She is also helped by well-wishers who are pleased with her marks. Sometimes, she helps my elder sister to do housework in her house so that she can be helped.

She even does not ~~live~~ live with us because our house is too small. Our last born is in class seven. He is 12 years old. Most of the times, we are sent home because we don't afford to pay school fees.

My mother has no permanent job. She rents a house at four hundred per month. Whenever she gets work to do (ie) working in people's garden. She is paid two hundred per day which is not regular and therefore sometimes we go on hungry.

Secondly, my mother has a problem with her leg which I have seen since I started understanding things. There are times she cannot do anything when it starts to ache. There are times that we do minor jobs like fetching for people water and we are paid so as to help my mother meet our needs.

And because of these challenges, I am terrified and confused because my dream of becoming a Journalist seems that it will not come true. It seems that class eight is the end of my education. I am working hard. In the last exam I attained three hundred and sixty two marks. I hope to get at least four hundred marks and above so that I can change our family status.

Lastly, I faithfully ask for your aid. I believe that you will assist me. May the Almighty God help you and also the ~~work~~ work of your hands and make it prosper and increase in countless number. Thank you.
